Key Outcomes

- review competitive systems and practices in their own work in a way that integrates with others in the team or work area who are also implementing competitive systems and practices.
- facilitate change processes in an organisation implementing competitive operational practices.
- effectively analyse the workplace in relation to environmentally sustainable work practices, and to implement improvements and monitor their effectiveness.
- undertake root cause analysis (RCA) contributing to an advanced maintenance strategy using RCA coupled with diagrams and charts.
- develop a culture within a team appropriate for supporting competitive systems and practices.
- assist others to use standardised work practices as a basis for continuous improvement in a competitive systems and practices environment.
- analyse a process that a team is responsible for and determine methods of mistake proofing it. This includes determining, implementing and sustaining improvement activities.
- improve changeovers and work on more than one product and to change between them as part of the work role.
- make process capability improvements, including analysing data from the process, developing improvements to eliminate variation due to assignable causes, and then implementing actions.
- gather and analyse process data to support the control of processes and operations, including interpretation of sampling procedures, frequency distributions, random and non-random variations in data/control charts; use of control limits to determine whether or not monitored processes are in control; and communicating this information to others.
- develop new strategies for competitive systems and practices or make improvements to existing systems and practices.
- manage the human relationship aspects of implementing and operating competitive systems and practices.
